But since many new members and followers have come to the Roundtable after 2006, some might not be aware that such additions and changes to *No Right to Win* are indeed available and easily accessible on this website.

So if you're a fan of the book, thank you sincerely, but be sure to follow through with its additional content if you haven't already. We have two key resources for it on the site:

# NOT RECEIVING EMAIL FROM THE ROUNDTABLE?

With over 400 subscribers worldwide, it's inevitable that there will be a few problems with any broadcast message that we send out. One of the most common is non-receipt: "I signed up with the Roundtable months ago, but I never get anything from you."

There can be a few reasons for that, but this is the most common by far: our first message to you is seen by your spam filter as coming from an unrecognized source, so it diverts the message to your spam or junk folder instead of your inbox. Time after time, this problem has been solved by simply opening your spam folder, finding our message, and marking it "not spam." Thereafter, your spam filter should pass messages from the same source directly to your inbox.

Here's how you can guarantee that you won't be having this problem: add us to the contacts or address book in your email app. As a preferred source, your spam filter will normally ignore an incoming message from a listed contact. If you haven't already done so, we recommend that you do that now—add the following two listings to your contacts:

Ron Russell midway.rt@gmail.com

That will solve a major portion of the email problems that we encounter with everything we send out. Thank you in advance for helping us solve this problem.
