FROM THE FIRST TO THE LAST

With deep regret, we announce the passing on 24 May 2025 of Col. John Miniclier, USMC- Retired, at the age of 103 years and 11 months. John had been a Roundtable stalwart for more than 20 years, having been brought aboard with several other Marines by fellow Midway vet Ed Fox around 2003. During that time he was a frequent contributor to the Roundtable Forum on preparations for the defense of Midway and his experience on the atoll during the Japanese air raid.

John was also a key participant in Midway commemorations, whether local or on Midway itself. He generously responded to frequent requests for interviews from students and others researching the BOM, and you can find him in a multitude of videos on Youtube and elsewhere.

John enlisted in the Marine Corps in August 1940 and served continuously for 35 years. After Midway he had a number of training assignments as he Private Miniclier, 1941

advanced through the ranks, including a college program to prepare for commission as an officer. He became a 2nd lieutenant in April 1946 and advanced to colonel in 1968.




